From Jet Fuel to Generational Impact: Thomas Prete's ('76) Ascent Through Faith and Engineering

Thomas Prete, a 1976 Saint Lawrence School alumnus has led an inspiring life characterized by faith, dedication, and service. Tom's father, an Air Force pilot and engineer, significantly influenced him after transitioning from military to civilian life here in West Haven. It was here that Tom began attending Saint Lawrence School in the fourth grade. This period marked the beginning of Tom's exposure to a structured Catholic environment, where he developed a blend of spiritual and intellectual curiosity. Throughout his youth, Tom absorbed the life lessons his father and teachers imparted, lessons of discipline, perseverance, and the importance of a strong moral compass. These values deeply influenced him as he moved on to attend Notre Dame High School where he continued his Catholic education, balancing his studies with his love of hockey.

Tom's education and his father's motivation taught him resilience. During moments of doubt in college (Southern and UConn), when the burden of math, science, and technology seemed overwhelming, it was his faith, education, and family that helped him realize he was fully equipped to pursue a career in engineering, turning what once felt like an insurmountable challenge into a clear path forward.

Post college, around the late 80's and early 90's, Tom was inspired by the movie <u>Top Gun</u> which resulted in his connecting all the dots. He combined his love for aviation, fighter jets, and engines with his desire to serve the country. This led him to Pratt & Whitney, where his career flourished, and he now serves as Vice President of Military Engineering. His leadership style, characterized by humility and equality, has been central to his team's success.

Tom lives happily with his wife Rose in Connecticut and is particularly proud of his three sons, two following in his footsteps in engineering, the third living his dream of medicine. Tom credits his achievements to the enduring influence of his religious education and the values his family and teachers instilled in him.

Today Tom's focus is on addressing the shortage of engineers in America. He is particularly concerned with reaching out to those without engineering influences in their lives and to women and those unaware of the potential in this field. Through initiatives like the \$500.00 scholarship for Promise in Engineering funded by Tom and his wife Rose, donations of technology from Pratt & Whitney, and his educational engineering presentations to Saint Lawrence School 7th and 8th graders, he is dedicated to nurturing the next generation of engineers. Tom's story is not just about professional achievement but about giving back and empowering others, a true testament to living a life of faith, passion, and purpose.
